GRETA VALLEY CFA—KEY ADVICE FOR FARMERS

Fire is an all year round risk management activity Farmers have legislative responsibilities during the Fire Danger Period Effective preparation and response means better recovery and return to business Limit or cease farm machinery activity on Severe, Extreme or Code Red days Farmers need to consider the needs of family, staff and contractors on their farm.

Essential steps before the fire season Planning

Have a routine in place for fire risk days (moving stock and limiting or postponing machinery use, switching off electric fences). Make sure everyone on your property is aware of it. Know your

trigger to leave early on fire risk days or the trigger for family members, employees or contractors to leave. Plan for contingencies- such as children at school.

<u>Fuel loads and stock</u> Reduce fuel loads around assets (house blocks, sheds and fences) and create strategic fuel breaks.

<u>Apply to the relevant authority</u> if you need to remove native vegetation or manage fuel on roadsides. Create a heavily grazed area where stock can be moved during a bushfire situation. Conduct a stock take of feed, animals and fencing before the fire season and keep a copy of records off your property.

<u>Permits and laws</u>. Make a list of legal restrictions (Fire Danger Period and Total Fire Ban) relevant to your property. Display it or keep it handy so everyone on your property can refer to it often and easily. Check with your council if local laws are in place for lighting fires, burning off or using incinerators. If going to burn off notify your local Fire Brigade first. Apply for a Schedule 13 permit from your local council if you intend to burn off weeds, stubble or vegetation during the FDP, or a schedule 14 permit if you intend to use fire for other purposes (e.g. machinery). Vehicles, equipment and hay. Double check that spark arrestors on machinery are working and efficient. Make sure chainsaws are free from faults.

<u>Have water fire extinguishers</u> or knapsack spray pumps (minimum 9 litres) available that can be carried by any person using farm equipment or machinery. Have a safety strategy in place for storing and monitoring hay - purchase a moisture meter if necessary. Make sure hay is fully cured before bailing. If you have private fire fighting equipment, conduct a 'refresher' session with family and employees to make sure everyone can use it.

Make sure that there are no gaps between cladding and the ground or slab of your sheds to prevent embers getting inside.

Access for fire fighters - Make sure your property name or number is clearly visible so emergency services can identify it easily when approaching the entrance. Check access tracks around your property. Consider if access for fire trucks can be improved by clearing vegetation, signposting dead ends or creating turning circles. Make sure water supplies around your property are clearly marked in case emergency services need to access them.

<u>If you plan to stay</u> and defend a building during a bushfire, take steps to establish a water supply of at least <u>10,000 litres</u> (independent of the mains supply).

GRETA VALLEY LANDCARE Greta West Weir - Options review

The Greta West Weir is located on the Fifteen Mile Creek adjoining O'Malley's Lane, approximately one kilometre downstream of Greta West. The weir acts as a diversion structure, supplying stock and domestic flows into both Middle Creek and One Mile Creek, which are positioned to the east of Fifteen Mile Creek.

Andrew Briggs from the North East CMA recently attended a Greta Valley Landcare Group committee meeting to discuss the current review of the weir structure at Greta West and outline the process so far.

Originally constructed to provide for water flows to the middle and one mile creek systems following the draining of the Greta Swamps, the weir now also provides a critical function in maintaining the stability of the 15mile channel at this point.

The weir has been steadily deteriorating for many years and failure of the weir would be catastrophic in terms of releasing sediment, increasing stream bed erosion up stream of the weir and removing any capacity for sharing of flows across the floodplain down the one mile and middle creek systems.

An 'options review' has been completed that presents five options. A further sixth option has been proposed by some landholders that will also be developed and incorporated into the options review. Following public consultation, a preferred option will be developed that can be enacted when funding becomes available. 
