Louis Thomas Legg was born in 6th of March 1894 He was born in Wangaratta.

His dad was Oliver George Legg and his mum was Marianne Whitehead.

Louis fought in World War I. His enlistment was in Melbourne in

His service number is 1054. When he enlisted his next of kin was his father.

He was in the Australian Light Horse Regiment.

Louis got shot in the right leg during battle. He got 3 medals ,a victory

medal, Star medal and British war medal. Louis died on the 1st April 1979 at the age of 85 in

Wangaratta.





John Legg



Birth date/death date: John Legg was born 11th February 1892 in Richmond. He went to fight in WW1 that started 28 July. He passed away 1st February 1984 in Kenmore, Brisbane, aged 91 10 days short of 92.

Parents/wife:

His parents were Oliver Legg and Marianne Legg. John Legg's wife was Olga Uhd they were married 20th June 1923, Olga passed away in 1951.

Job: John Legg worked as a veterinary surgeon and an inspector of livestock and meat, retiring in 1957.





HUGH JOHN DELANEY



Hugh John Delaney was a light horse signal trooper.

His parents were Mary Bryan and Michael Delaney.

He was born in Greta 1897and he died in Wangaratta 1994.

He was only 96 when he died.

His sisters and brothers were Joseph, Patrick, Mary, Jane, Micheal,

Daniel and Francis Delaney.

Hugh and his brothers both went to War in World War1.

Hugh's wife was Nora Sheila Hickey, he married her in 1923.

Hugh's religion was roman catholic.

He joined the army on the 25 of April 1918.

His service number was 64190.

He was aged 21, when he joined the 8 light horse.

Trooper William Petty

William Petty was born in Greta in 1877, with parents Mary Gillon and John Bates Petty. He was the eldest of three children, with sisters Levina(1881) and Sarah(1885) being younger. William died from Typhoid Fever at the young age of 23 in Pretoria, South Africa. Due to William dying overseas, he is not buried at the Greta cemetery, but a monument was erected to the memory of William Petty in 1901.

William served in South Africa in the Boer war from the start of the war in 1899 until he died of typhoid fever on the 27th December 1900. William went with the bushmen's contingent. It was in one of the roughest parts of South Africa were they had their first battle with the enemy. William Petty and another soldier took cover behind a rock. It was a dangerous position, as a bullet hit the ground near his face covering it with dust. There were 300 Victorians against 1,000 B oers, but they accomplished their task without serious consequences. Private William Petty did not get any injuries in five encounters with the enemy, but got enteric fever. Shortly after the last battle William was taken to the hospital where he died a few days later of Typhoid Fever.









In Remembrance of

Hector Sinclair

Hector Sinclair was born in Greta in 1877 and died in Wangaratta in 1955 at the age of 74 years old. He fought in the Boer War. It was in South Africa and started in 1899 and ended in 1902. The Boer war was against the African white settlers. The Boer war was the first war that Australia had ever fought in. He joined the NSW imperial bushmen and was trooper #97.



Albert James Grass Born: 11 of May 1880 at Lara.

Died: 23 of November 1978 in Beechworth, at the age of 98.

Albert joined the army on the 11th August 1915, to fight in the first World War in the 11th light horse trooper. Then when the war had ended he returned back to his home. Then years later he joined the army at Portsea to fight in the second World War.





John Hunter Dinning

Born: 12 July 1917 Wangaratta

Died: 3rd February 2001

Age at Death: 86

Wife: Margaret Culph

Mother: Amy Barid

Father: John Hunter Dinning. He

died in 1966

Grandpa: John Hunter Dinning. He died in 1929

John joined the army in Queensland. His service number was VX81866. He fought in World War II and came back alive and well. Later on he past away from old age.

He had 3 children and their names were John, Gaile and Helen. He was a Sergeant in the 16 Infantry. Originally he was in the Eighth Light Horse Contingent. He also was a well known player for the Greta Football Club.

Robert John Jack McMonigle


Birth: 29th of December 1883

Robert joined the army at the age of 31 in Melbourne on 29th of December 1914. Jack was a trooper in the 13th light horse.

His mother was Ann Graham and his dad was John McMonigle.He returned to Australia on the 11th of May 1919.

He fought in the First World war beginning in 1914.

Project update - Fosters Lake Glenrowan



A big thanks to North East Water, Glenrowan CFA, Hammex (local earthmoving contractors) and Mawsons Glenrowan for their help in our Fosters Lake project at Glenrowan. North East Water and the Glenrowan CFA did an amazing job of draining the lake so that machinery operators could get in to clean out the overgrown Typha (Cumbungi) and provide some deeper habitat areas in the lake bed. Mawsons carted 38 truck loads of silt from this small part of the lake that we were able to work on! A total of about 300 cubic metres of silt was removed. We really appreciate the volunteer support and generosity of these organisations as we couldn't have completed our work without their help. Once the lake has refilled from rainfall, we will be able to translocate the Southern Pygmy Perch into the lake. We also have some shrubs ordered for planting in the reserve and are looking for willing volunteers to assist at our planting day in late June (date TBA). 




Heating tips

- Ensure heaters are installed, maintained and operated according to manufacturer's instructions.
- Turn off all heating devices before leaving home or going to sleep.
- Drying clothes and other items must be kept at least one metre away from all heating.
- Children and pets must be supervised near all types of heating. Maintain a safe distance between children and heating.
- For portable heating appliances choose models that have automatic safety switches that turn the heater off if tipped over.

Chimney tips

- Use a torch to check for creosote build-up or obstructions.
- Have your chimney professionally cleaned annually.
- Only burn dry, clean wood.
- Extinguish your fire before going to bed or leaving the house.

This is a really simple onground action that everyone can do regardless of property size. The guards come pre-rolled, are easy to transport and we can provide guidance on installation.

You can also watch a recorded webinar discussing the benefits of planting new trees, protecting natural recruitment, recommended tree species and planting densities and advice on where to plant your trees at www.tinyurl.com/MOLCYouTube

- Native tree (tube stock) suitable for your area + cardboard guard
- Large wire guard (approx. 1.8m tall, 0.7-0.85m diameter). Retail price of guards is \$64, so this represents a great cost saving.
