A WORD FROM THE CFA

With the wet summer and green grass we are all enjoying, the fire risk may not be over for this summer.

We still have a few months of hot weather left, the risk of grass fires is still possible.

Don't drop your guard and still keep your properties prepared for the fire season.

Have you checked your gutters for leaves, and removed the fuel load around your home and sheds.

Take care with long grass and be mindful of the use of angle grinders and welders.

Don't park over long grass. The catalytic converters on petrol engine cars are hot enough to start fires.

Keep grass short & preferably clear around machinery that can start fires.

Pumps, both petrol & electric can start fires, either throwing sparks when running rough or if they are old and choked up. Also check bearings on electric pumps which are stalling and overheating.

23rd February 12-1pm

Maintaining ground cover over summer is incredibly important to mitigate high soil temperatures, maintain biological soil health, reduce soil disturbance in summer storm events, protect pasture quality and increase organic matter and carbon capture in soils. The guest speaker for this webinar is Damien Adcock who is a Research Agronomist with Barenbrug Australia. Damien has completed his PhD on soil science and has a strong understanding of the benefit of ground cover and links to soil organic carbon and organic matter. GRANT FUNDING

Funding for works on Boggy Creek, 15 Mile Creek and upper tributaries

The programs will allow landholders to obtain assistance for works on their waterway frontage including weed control, pest animal control (deer and feral pigs), fencing and revegetation. Contributions will be required for some activities (e.g. 30% landholder contribution towards blackberry and woody weed control, \$0.50/plant towards revegetation). Round 2 of the program is now open. 
Grant funding for plants in 2022



Waves follows the story of Alice, a hospice care worker who meets Elizabeth Moncello, the unofficial inventor of the butterfly stroke. Over many cups of tea, Alice learns how Liz, during her youth, taught herself how to swim by watching the aquatic life surrounding her small Victorian island home in the 1930s. With her incredible skill and determination, she makes it to the Berlin Olympics where she introduces the new stroke to the world and wins Gold.

A delightful tale of historical fiction, Waves is an intimate theatrical event that combines highly expressive storytelling, delicate movement and splashes of humour to tell the story of a life fully lived.

Waves is about having an idea and the courage, drive and desire to follow it through, to swim against the tide of history and expectations, and to achieve something that is truly incredible. While the character of Elizabeth is fictional, the work is an homage to the incredible pioneering female swimmers of the early 1900s and women 'of a certain age' that society has largely forgotten.


