Is there a working smoke alarm in your bedroom?

Aside from the <u>minimum ones required by law</u>, you have the choice of selecting the type and price of smoke alarms for your bedroom and living room that best suits your needs and budget.

Here are some suggested options:

Good smoke alarms Costs from: \$20 each + annual battery replacement costs	Smoke alarms powered by a 9-volt battery Cons: Cost to replace battery each year
Better smoke alarms Costs from: \$30 each	A smoke alarm powered by a 10-year lithium battery in a tamper-proof chamber Pros: The battery will not need to be replaced each year
The best Smoke Alarms Costs from: \$90 each	Wireless interconnected smoke alarm with a 10-year lithium backup battery Pros: When one smoke alarm sounds, all alarms will sound.
