The potential impact of weeds on our public land

Definition: A wild (not deliberately cultivated) plant growing where it is not wanted.

Depending on whether we are a gardener, agricultural producer or land manager, our views may differ on which plants are considered weeds in our local area.

When it comes to roadsides and waterways in our local areas, we have some typical weed suspects that are declared noxious weeds. For example, blackberry, willow, hawthorn, gorse, broom, etc. The level of control for declared noxious weeds depends upon the weed category, but generally we have a responsibility to manage them on our land and prevent further spread.

Many of the weeds on our roadsides and waterways are listed as **Environmental Weeds**. These species are not declared as noxious weeds, and so there is no legal requirement for control, however they do present a threat to our local biodiversity. This includes species that have been introduced to Australia from other countries, as well as native species that have spread beyond their natural ranges (e.g. Cootamundra Wattle). Some of our common environmental weeds include Desert Ash, Box Elder, White Cedar, Apple, Prunus, Olive, Fig, Privet, Poplar.

Whilst these weeds may be suitable in gardens, they can easily spread to roadsides and waterways where they quickly become a problem. These weeds all produce either copious amounts of seed or fruit, spread by birds and wind respectively. The generating seedlings can choke native vegetation and populations of environmental weeds can quickly multiply.

Please make smart decisions on your farm when it comes to introducing exotic and garden species. Ask your nursery or research online to ensure that you are not introducing a potential weed to your local environment.
